

BEYOND BASICS CROCHET: TEXTURES AND TECHNIQUES

In this class, you'll learn four new stitches and techniques - the bobble, popcorn, corner-to-corner (C2C), and front/back post double crochet. Each project we make will help you practice a different skill. You'll make small, practical projects while gaining confidence reading patterns and finishing your work neatly. Students should already know how to make a basic chain, single, double and half-double crochet stitches. NOTE: Please bring the following supplies to class: two(2) skeins of worsted weight - acrylic or cotton (#4 medium) yarn, size H/8(5 mm) or I/9(5.5 mm) crochet hook, scissors, tapestry needle, stitch markers, and notebook.

CREATIVE NONFICTION 101

This four-week writing and critique workshop is open to all writers who are interested in the art of effectively telling true stories. We will explore what creative nonfiction is (telling a true story in a creative way using elements of fiction such as plot, setting, and character development) and what it isn't (using creative license to the point in which a story is no longer true). Through a blend of instruction, reading time, writing time and (optional) individual critique sessions, participants will gain exposure to various types of creative nonfiction and engage in meaningful discussion about telling true stories. The class offers the option to receive feedback on students own works in progress. A significant portion of the class will consist of critique, in which participants offer feedback on other participants work. Participants are encouraged to bring a work in progress (2,500 words or less) OR an idea for an essay or another creative nonfiction project, to the first session. Writing sessions may also utilize provided writing prompts. All participants are encouraged to come with questions relating to the genre.
